James is the director of the popular James O'Donnell Band and he is also co-director of the "Planet D Nonet" Jazz ensemble which has earned nine Detroit Music Awards honors. As a noted Detroit trumpeter, James has performed in 13 states and in more than a dozen foreign countries. He has also played for several legendary music artists.

James is a Master at his craft. Like an artist who paints wonderful artworks, James uses his trumpet as a brush, music notes as his paint and an audience as his canvas.

The result is a memorable music masterpiece for all to enjoy.

James O Donnell BIDGRAPHY



James O'Donnell has been entertaining Detroit audiences with his special brand of music for more than three decades.

While known primarily as a trumpeter, he also plays flugelhorn and coronet. And while his favorite music genres are Jazz, Big Band, Standards, and Blues, his repertoire also includes R&B, Funk, Soul, Motown.

Over the course of his career, James has performed in more than 15 countries in North America, Europe, Africa, and Asia.

Here in Detroit, James has graced stages at renowned venues like Ford Field, Meadowbrook Theater, Cobo Center, Hart Plaza, The Masonic Temple Theater, The Dearborn Performing Arts Center, and The Detroit Institute of Arts.

James' music career began at age 9 when a member of The Detroit Symphony Orchestra introduced him to the trumpet. He loved the instrument immediately and began practicing it fervently. Then when he was 14, he joined the Jazz Band, Concert Band and Marching Band at his high school. He studied music theory and harmony and earned a spot in the All City All Star Jazz Orchestra.

At age 16, James became part of a group called "Kuumba," which means "creativity" in Swahili. It was his first exposure to the music of Jazz legends, John Coltrane, Sun Ra and The Art Ensemble of Chicago. Eventually, the band morphed into the famed "Sun Messengers." During that time James learned the Costello embouchure technique and the Max Schlossberg teaching method.

After graduating high school, James formed his first band. The Jazz sextet was called "Chronology - Music of All Times" and they played at local Jazz joints around Detroit.

In his early 20s, James played primarily with The Sun Messengers. They opened for The Neville Brothers, Buckwheat Zydeco and Dirty Dozen Brass Band.

In 1986, James moved to New York City and played in the Destiny Merengue Orchestra. That same year he began working an eight-year stint working for the cruise ship industry. There he played in show bands backing up stars like Julie Andrews, John Davidson and Charo. He also played for bands like The Regular Boys, The Blues Disciples and Art of Fact.

BIOGRAPHY



In 1994, James formed a New Orleans Jazz-style band called "Bon Temps Roulle" ("Let the Good Times Roll"). They opened for David Sanborn at Meadowbrook Music Theater and for Dr. John at The Detroit Jazz Festival. They also performed at Ford Field, Fishbone's and The Town Pump.

As a musician, James played for The Four Tops, Martha Reeves, The Dramatics, Pine Top Perkins, Hubert Sumlin, Russell Green, and Lee Oscar. After the Millennium, James played and recorded with Detroit Blues Legends, Johnny Bassett, Sir Mack Rice and The Falcons, Alberta Adams, Odessa Harris, and Thornetta Davis.

In 2007, James joined RJ Spangler as the co-leader of the "Planet D Nonet" band. They performed throughout the Midwest and on the Southern circuit, earning numerous awards and recording more than a dozen CDs. Separately, he formed the "Nicky Boy Street Band" that plays New Orleans Jazz and Dixieland Jazz and opened for The Detroit Jazz Festival in 2009 and 2010.

Over the past decade James' primary focus has been performing with Planet D Nonet at major events like The Detroit Jazz Festival, The Lansing Jazz Festival and The Grand Rapids Jazz Festival as well as at premier local Jazz hotspots like Cliff Bell's and The Dirty Dog Jazz Cafe.

In addition to his extraordinary trumpet playing, James also entertains audiences by singing parts of the songs he plays and interacting with his fans.

One of the unique features of James' trumpet play is that he specializes in the nearly lost Swing-era techniques like growling and half-valving as well as the use of the plunger and mutes.

When asked to name his favorite music and artists, he responded: "I love playing Classic Jazz Standards from The Great American Songbook as well as hits from the great bands of the 20s, 30s and 40s. I especially like to play the song stylings of Louis Armstrong, Nat King Cole, Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis Jr., Ella Fitzgerald, Dinah Washington, Billie Holiday, and the music of the great Blues singers like Bessie Smith, Ma Rainey, Lizzie Miles, and Etta James. As a musician, I am a trumpet Stylist along the lines of Louis Armstrong, Harry James, Cootie Williams, Al Hirt, and Russell Green."

James O'Donnell is a Musician and a Singer – but most of all, James is an Entertainer who loves to share his music with audiences. He is one of Detroit's finest.
